

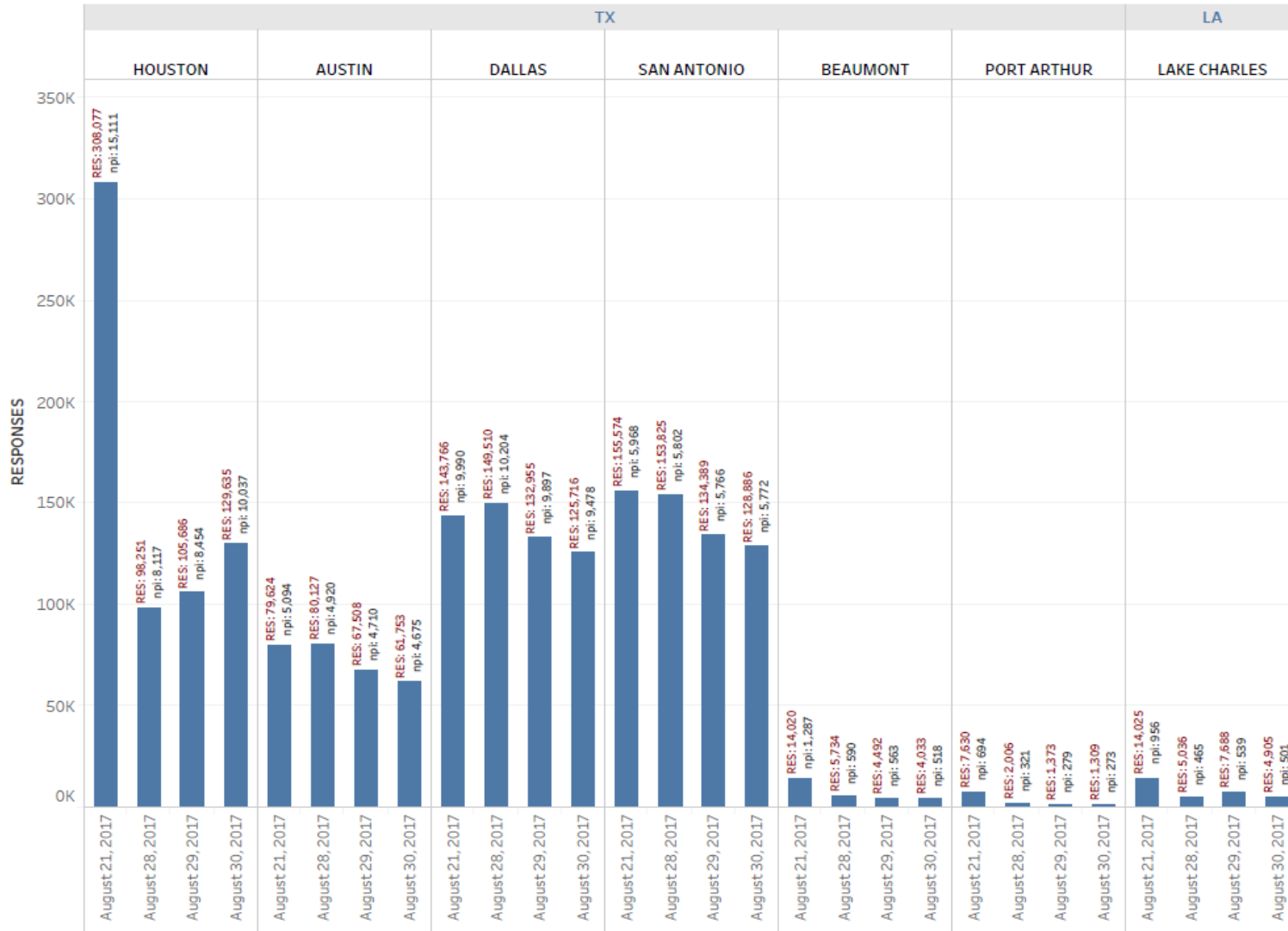
HURRICANE HARVEY: DATA TRENDS

AS OF AUGUST 30, 2017

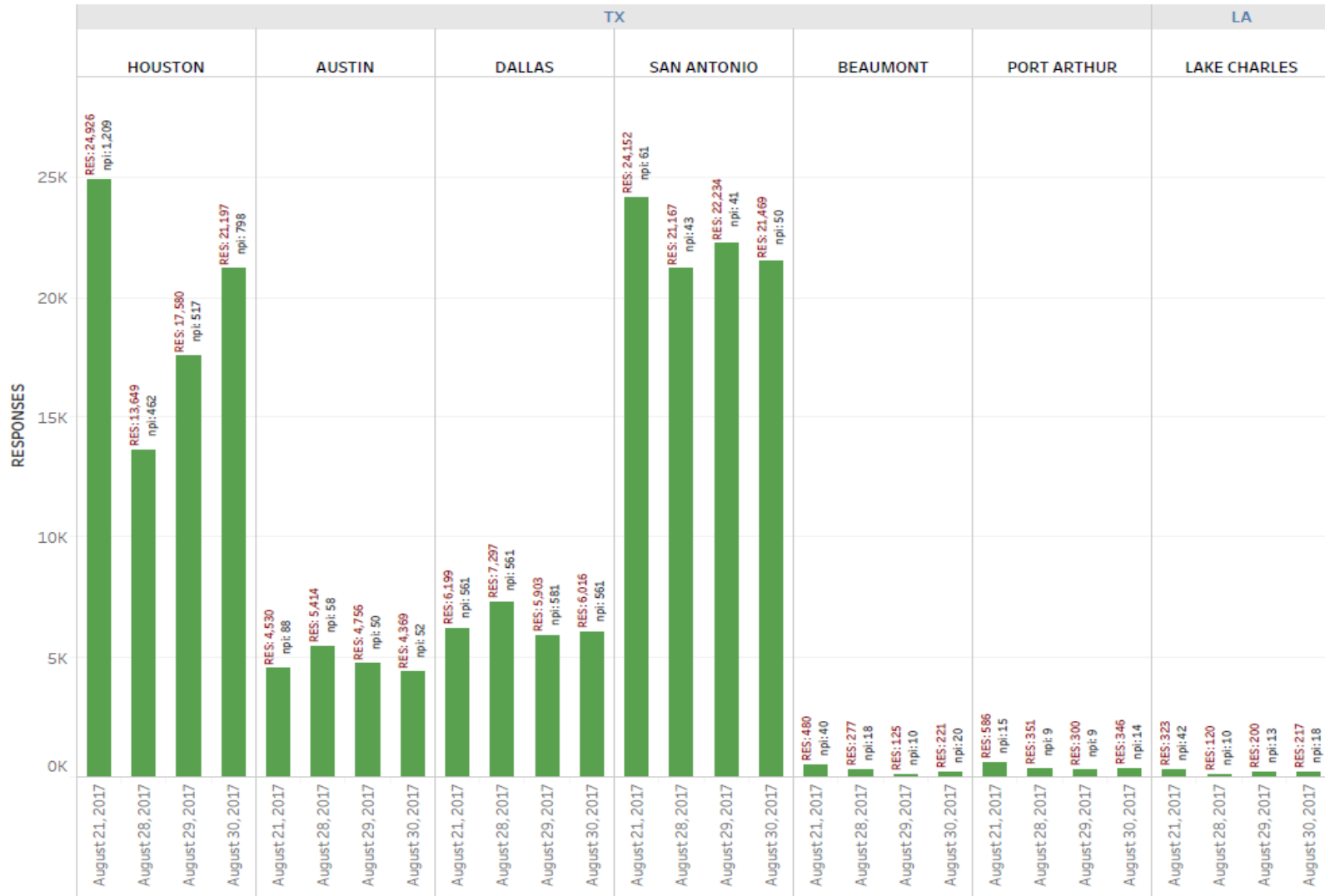
KEY FINDINGS

- There was a significant decline in Medication History Ambulatory transactions in Houston when Harvey hit, going from 300,000+ transactions on a typical Monday to 98,000 on August 28; No significant change was observed in Austin, Dallas and San Antonio as of August 28. Transaction volume gradually increased on August 29 and August 30. Beaumont, Port Arthur and Lake Charles also saw a decline in volume on August 28.
- There was a less significant decline in Medication History for Reconciliation transactions in Houston when Harvey hit, going from 24,000+ transactions on a typical Monday to 13,000 on August 28; Transaction volume was slowly climbing back up on August 29 and 30; There was a slight increase in Austin and Dallas, but not in San Antonio during the same time period. The volume remained relatively low in Beaumont, Port Arthur and Lake Charles.
- There was a huge decline in new electronic prescriptions in Houston, Beaumont, Port Arthur and Lake Charles when Harvey hit. In Houston for example, NewRx volume went from 52,000 transactions on a typical Monday to 3,500 on August 28; There was no significant change in Austin, Dallas and San Antonio. Transaction volume gradually increased on August 29 and August 30.

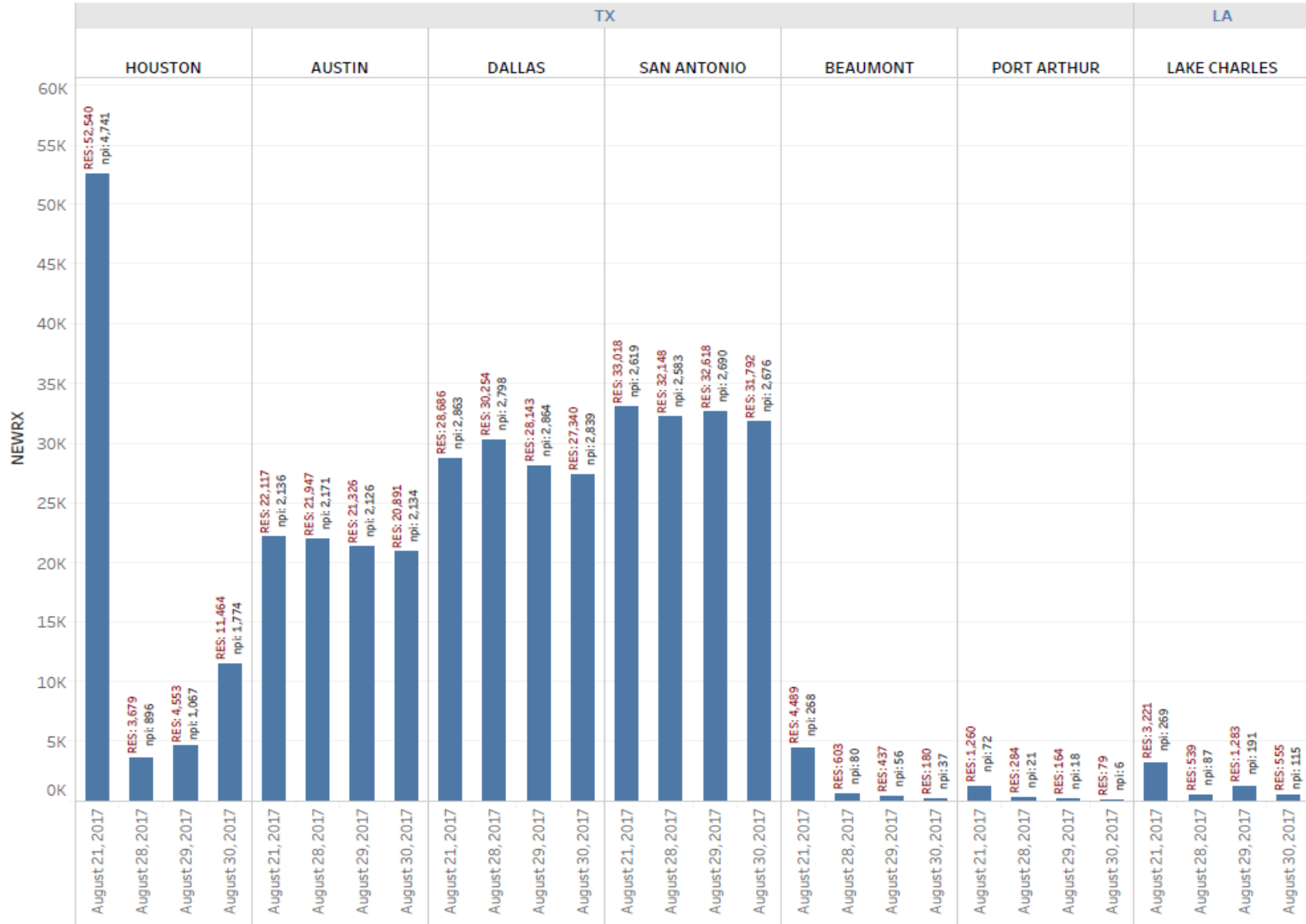
Medication History Ambulatory
